Commissioner Comments

Commissioner Rose hopes everyone had an equally good two weeks. He appreciates staff input and getting up to date in the Port. Commissioner Green said the workshop was a success. There were a lot of ideas, dialogue, and good, positive feedback. A lot of people would like to see another workshop here in another couple of months. There's a lot of value added in opening up the opportunity to meet with fellow city members. Commissioner Singer said there's a lot to do in the Port. The upgrade to the breakwater will be great for the City and increase the amount of people who can visit, increase the income for downtown businesses, and increase people who can go visit the waterfront.

Public Comments

Dave looks forward to another workshop. The participation shows well for the public. He touched on the fact that the breakwater will be part of the trail system that'll be in the south end of the trail on to the breakwater. He recommended anticipating being prepared for some sort of discussing/planning or consideration of a water feature out there to help welcome people and boaters. It would help draw them out to the breakwater and enjoy the waterfront. There would be heavy electrical service required to support amenities. If that's something the board wants to consider, now would be the time to include those details in the planning.

Old Business Items

Breakwater & Boat Ramp Updates - John Piccone

Mr. Piccone gave a lengthy update at previous meeting. There have not been many changes. Regarding breakwater concerns by the Suquamish Tribe, the meeting on the 13th was successful and somewhat productive. Commissioner Rose and Port Accountant Tripp were also in attendance. We are going ahead and making formal responses to their comments that will be submitted to the City of Poulsbo. Mr. Piccone anticipates having more than one round of comments from the tribe, and we'll have to go back and forth a couple of times. He's optimist we'll get things ironed out. The federal Boating Infrastructure Grant (BIG) funds have been made available to the state. This is the grant that was awarded to the Port of Poulsbo and is in the amount of \$1.44 million. All the grant funding will be in place for the schedule we're planning on. Regarding the boat ramp, things are moving smoothly with the City. We did the get the shoreline exception, and the permitting process is moving along.

Mr. Piccone stated he has received feedback from Commissioner Green and Commissioner Rose regarding the comprehensive scheme and is anticipating getting Commissioner Singer's feedback soon. He recommended considering whether to discuss the feedback in the first or second meeting in November and to give thought if that ought to be an agenda item. The D Dock Gangway replacement is moving forward. All the quotes are in and he and Port Accountant Tripp are going everything. They will be authorizing a contractor here soon in the next week.

Recycling

Port Accountant Tripp explained during the renovations to the downtown parking lot, the Port lost their separate dumpster area. The Port then had an agreement with the downtown restaurants to share a dumpster area. There were three restaurants and all licensees sharing

that area. The garbage and recycling were getting grossly overfilled. Port Accountant Tripp received complaints of someone regularly filling the recycling bins completely full after emptying the back of their pickup truck. Port Accountant Tripp was able to find the person based on their license plate number so she can confirm it was a tenant. She affirmed the Port of Poulsbo wants to utilize the service and encourage the practice of recycling. After the tenant emptied the entire back of the pickup truck into the recycling, on more than one occasion, she was receiving angry phone calls from restaurants unable to use the dumpster because it was too full. Port Accountant Tripp explained the complications of bin sizes, costs, and other accommodations. At some point something has got to give, and recycling was it. She is happy to put recycling over on the guest side, but there's not enough room to put on the permanent side. The service provided was once a week pick up for \$14.86 per month for one 96-gallon bin, and there were 7-11 bins available. As of now, recycling is not available at the Port of Poulsbo, but options will continue to be explored.

Accounting & Manager Report – October 15, 2020

The Port's new website will be live tomorrow October 16th. Be aware that if you are using "Chrome" as your internet browser, you may see a delay of up to 48 hours due to a security issue that we're working on with GoDaddy currently. There will be some fine tuning over the course of the next couple of weeks.

The Governor's proclamation 20-19.4 was extended until December 31, 2020 regarding the eviction moratorium. This has directly impacted the Port in several ways; the first is that we still have a vessel that has been secured due to non-payment (back in 03/06/2020). At this date, the individual owes \$3,775.53 and by the end of the year, the amount owing will be over \$4,000.00. This licensee is not a liveaboard but because of the way the proclamation is drafted, the Port can not remove him until the proclamation is ended.

The other way this proclamation impacts the Port is that we are forced to examine each and every boater that enters into the marina in the off chance that they could default on their moorage and we would again be forced to supply moorage and utilities to a non-paying licensee for months on end.

The Port is once again being contacted regularly by the general public, neighboring marina's, the Poulsbo Fire Department and various other entities about vessels that are anchored out in the bay or vessels that are dragging anchor. The Port of Poulsbo personnel and equipment are covered by our insurance only to our harbor lines and no further. We are not able to assist vessels that are outside of those boundaries. It is very difficult on our staff when they are dealing with a person who expects the Port to rescue a vessel that is well beyond those boundaries. It is even more difficult when the vessel happens to 'mysteriously' arrive at the Port's docks the next day and we have to locate the owners, then come to find out that the owners have no insurance or funds to pay for moorage and they are unwilling to leave (see Governor's proclamation 20-19.4).

We have started to receive bids on the 'D' Dock Ramp project, and it appears that the project will come in under budget. I would like to request that any overage of funding on this project go towards a security camera system for the Port before the end of the year. I can get a proposal together for the next meeting if this is acceptable to the Board. I would like to complete this project before the end of the year.

Lastly, I had a good conversation with Holly Hill from WWU-Sea Discovery Center regarding an educational program encompassing the new sea-bins, the FLUPSY, and general marine education.

On Friday later afternoon October 9th during the windstorms there was a vessel that had broke anchor out on south side of Liberty Bay Marina. At the time of the phone calls coming into our office the maintenance and myself were out checking the vessels and docks in our marina. It was mentioned later that Poulsbo pd did not have a marine officer on duty to help assist at that time. The boat had made it to the beach. Come Tuesday morning the 13th that same boat ended up making it around the south end breakwater and log boom into our marina between two vessels on linear side of AA dock. Richard and I went over and towed vessel over to the guest docks until we could locate the owner. After running WN and speaking with the Poulsbo police dept. We did find the owner and he was very thankful for the Port not only trying to locate him but also securing his boat until he could get here instead of letting it continue bouncing around Liberty Bay.

Maintenance still working on their monthly checklist. we are also preparing for colder weather with stocking up on certain supplies salt & freeze valves for example.

We have 17 transient vessels in winter moorage, and we are only ½ through the 1st month of winter moorage, this is the same amount we had during 2019/2020 season.

Will be conducting an annual Fuel dock refresher training with staff tomorrow during our safety meeting.

Working on creating a poll for the marina to see what boat generated materials are most in need of disposal. Because the Port is limited to how much we can transport to the facility. For example, they can only take so many gallons of oil or gas a day. As soon as it is set up the PBA will put a link on their Facebook page.

Fisherman Chris Attwood on "Maja" came into Port today. Went onto D dock this morning and welcomed him back to the Port and let him know we are so happy he is back. Chris replied it feels good to be back at the Port and with familiar faces and that it feels good that he is back in Poulsbo.
